PARENT ENGAGEMENT MATTERS

Studies show that student achievement and wellbeing improves when parents play an active role in their children's education, and that good schools become even better schools when parents are involved. Students are more likely to be motivated, to earn higher grades, to have better behaviour and social skills, and to continue their education to a higher level when their parents are actively engaged in supporting their success at school.

Try incorporating some of these ideas into your School Council planning, to develop deeper parent/family engagement. Get creative with Social Media and your Zoom account. And don't forget about your virtual families.

- Invite a teacher to speak at your School Council meeting about education initiatives being used in the classroom
- Invite your school Social Worker to speak about the Mental Health issues most commonly faced at your school
- Host an online family Mindfulness session
- Host a Virtual Math Night for families
- Host an online Story-Telling event for families
- Ask the Principal to explain the school budget
- Invite parents to a School Improvement Plan (SIP) session
- Host a virtual family nutrition event
- Invite your Guidance Counsellor to give a parent presentation on high school course selection
- Host a discussion session for your virtual families
- Organize a virtual family Scavenger Hunt

PRO (PARENT REACHING OUT) GRANTS -PROGRAM PRIORITIES FUNDING (PPF)

The Ministry of Education Parent Reaching Out Grants (PRO) are now distributed directly to school boards.

- The Ministry of Education has informed the TDSB that it will be receiving funding under the 2020-2021 Priorities and Partnerships Fund for the PRO Grant. The PRO Grant program provides funding to district school boards and school authorities to lead projects with a focus on the identification and removal of barriers that prevent parents and families from participating and engaging fully in their children's learning.
- TDSB was allocated \$131, 563.00 for projects that demonstrate a commitment to respecting the role of parents in students' educational experiences. All funds must be spent and reported to the Ministry by August 21, 2021.
- The board is consulting with PIAC, Superintendents, and Trustees to identify initiatives that fall within the scope of the funding.
