PARENT REACHING OUT GRANTS 2019/20

The Ministry of Education Parent Reaching Out Grants (PRO) have been distributed differently this year, directly to school boards.

The TDSB received \$133,405.35 for projects that demonstrate a commitment to respecting the role of parents in students' educational experiences. The board consulted with PIAC, Superintendents, and Trustees to identify initiatives that fall within the following areas:

- Supporting and enhancing School Council capacity
- Enhancing the efficacy of families around mental health and wellbeing, equity or achievement
- Engagement of diverse families and school councils in the School Improvement Process

The Board approved the allocation as follows: Learning Network / Centre & Ward Engagement (\$103,405.35) 2020 Parents as Partners (PAP) Conference on March 28 (\$30,000)

PARENT PARTICIPATION ON THE SIP School Improvement Planning Review

Schools are required by O.Reg 612 of the Education Act to involve parents in the development of the School's Improvement Plan (SIP). The TDSB is creating guidelines to assist Principals with engaging their parent community in the SIP.

The interim guidelines focus on better explaining the process and seeking out diverse family input.
