Parent/Caregiver Engagement is a relationship between home and school that supports and improves student outcomes. It is rooted in our identities and enhances the ability of parents/caregivers to support students.

To build engagement in your school and School Council, take time to build understanding between families and staff so you can work in partnership to improve student success.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

The Ministry of Education and the TDSB require that parents/caregivers play a collaborative role in the creation of the SIP.

Your Principal should engage parents and caregivers from the diverse population of your school to participate in the school improvement process.

The Principal prepares the annual School Improvement Plan (SIP) each Fall in consultation with parents and the school community. Each school's SIP identifies where their students are at risk or under-achieving, then sets goals describing how and when the school will address the gaps. The SIP has three areas of focus: School Belonging/Well-being, Achievement, and Indigenous Education & Sovereignty. Equity will be embedded within the School Belonging/Well-being and Achievement goal and focussed on disproportionate outcomes.

Coming soon: new parent/caregiver and principal tools to help schools bring input from the whole community to the School Improvement Plan.

School Statement of Needs

Every year, parents complete the <u>School</u> <u>Statement of Needs (SSON)</u>. This document identifies what is unique about your school community, and is used by the Superintendent to place administrators in your school.

The SSON is due to your Superintendent at the end of November. Update your School Statement of Needs with the PIAC Guide, Templates and more resources, found in this SSON Toolkit.
