   Council and parents/caregivers to
   develop your bylaws draft
- Approval School Council reviews draft template to select optional sections & any articles from previous bylaws
- Submission Chair submits the bylaw template to the PCEO by December 23, 2022
- Return your new School Council Bylaws will be returned to you (Word & pdf)
