Your first council meeting of the year should strike a balance between information sharing and information collecting, in a comfortable atmosphere.

- · School Council mandate improving student achievement
- School Profile information about your community
- Council activities overview

#### **Collect community information:**

- Council email sign-up
- Survey what parents want (within the council mandate)
- Talk to each other welcome, idea sharing

#### Elections

#### By-Laws

By-laws formally define the standards & principles of an organization. By-laws make it easier for a council to operate consistently and transparently. Councils must use the <u>TDSB by-law template</u>. For more about writing council by-laws go to our <u>By-laws page</u>.
